The ISO 14001 Lead Auditor – Environmental Management System (EMS) course equips participants with the knowledge and skills needed to plan, conduct, report, and follow up on EMS audits in compliance with ISO 14001 standards. It covers the principles of environmental management, audit processes, and best practices for assessing conformance and effectiveness. Through a combination of practical exercises and theoretical learning, participants gain the competence to lead audits and support organizations in achieving and maintaining ISO 14001 certification.

This course is ideal for auditors aiming to lead or perform Environmental Management System (EMS) certification audits, managers and consultants looking to master the EMS audit process, individuals responsible for ensuring EMS compliance, technical experts preparing for EMS audits, and environmental management advisors seeking to deepen their expertise.
