

# Strategic Intelligence and Threat Assessment for Public Safety

## COURSE OVERVIEW

This course provides public safety professionals with foundational knowledge and skills in strategic intelligence and threat assessment. It covers the intelligence cycle, methods for collecting and analyzing data, and producing actionable intelligence products. It also emphasizes practical techniques for information gathering, collaboration among agencies, and strategic communication to mitigate risks and improve response effectiveness. Participants will learn to evaluate threats, prioritize risks, and support decision-making processes to enhance public safety operations.

## WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

This course is designed for public safety professionals, law enforcement officers, intelligence analysts, emergency management personnel, security practitioners, and policymakers aspiring to build careers in security and intelligence studies. It is also relevant to organizational leaders responsible for risk management and crisis response.
