

## Tactical Field Medicine and Emergency Response in Hostile Environments

### COURSE OVERVIEW

This course offers insight into providing medical and emergency response skills for hostile and tactical environments. It focuses on delivering critical care in situations where safety is compromised by threats such as active violence, conflict zones, or unstable conditions. The course equips participants with knowledge of tactical field medicine principles, including casualty assessment, haemorrhage control, airway management, and trauma care under fire. It also covers emergency evacuation techniques, coordination with tactical teams, and managing care under stress and limited resources. Practical exercises and scenario-based training will help participants develop the ability to deliver life-saving medical interventions quickly and effectively in high-risk situations.

### WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

The course is designed for military personnel, law enforcement officers, private security contractors, emergency responders, humanitarian aid workers, and other professionals operating in conflict zones or high-risk environments. It is also valuable for medical practitioners and first responders who may be deployed or tasked with providing care in remote or hostile areas where immediate access to hospitals and advanced facilities is limited.

### COURSE OUTCOMES

Delegates will gain the skills and knowledge to:

- Develop competence in providing emergency medical care in hostile or resource-limited environments.
- Apply tactical combat casualty care (TCCC) principles, including haemorrhage control, airway management, and shock treatment.
- Demonstrate effective casualty evacuation techniques under fire or threat.
- Enhance situational awareness and decision-making in high-stress, high-threat scenarios.
- Integrate medical response within broader tactical and operational frameworks.

- Hands-on training with simulated combat and disaster scenarios.
- Emphasis on Tactical Combat Casualty Care (TCCC) protocols.
- Techniques for operating in low-resource and high-threat environments.

- How to focus on rapid, lifesaving interventions to maximize survival in hostile conditions.
